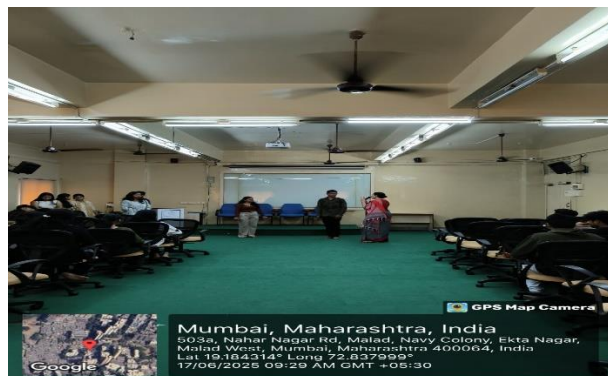


## SFC ACADEMIC AUDIT REPORT 2025-26
